



Bottom Line: The Book of Acts ends in the same way it began, with the Kingdom being proclaimed and the name of Jesus spreading.

Warm Up:

1. Start your small group time with prayer. Share stories about what God is up to and pray for those who don't yet follow Jesus.
2. How have you felt the Spirit "sending" you this summer? How are you acting on his leading?

Dig In:

3. Much of the last several chapters of Acts revolve around Paul and some of his struggles as he spread the Gospel. Read Matthew 6:25-33, emphasizing the last verse. Compare this with Paul's life. What does putting the kingdom first equal? How have you done this in the past? What was the result? How is God calling you to do this now?
4. The end of Paul's life was somewhat chaotic. Read John 16:33 and talk about a time you experienced some of the trouble Jesus mentions. How did he overcome that for you? How did this affect your faith?
5. Has there ever been a time when you were struggling and you felt that you couldn't hear from God? How did this affect you? What was the outcome?
6. In Acts 26, we read about Paul's defense before King Agrippa which ends with Paul essentially asking Agrippa if he believes. Talk about a time you actually shared your faith with someone. How did they respond? How did their response motivate you?

Live Out:

8. How can you put the Kingdom first this week? Where is the Spirit sending you?
