Authentic Community:

1. Share with the group something that you read from the Bible Reading Plan that challenged you. How is God leading you to change as a result?

3. How do you normally use the word love? What has been your experience with the word and the emotion? How does this defer from the Biblical definition of love?
4. Read John 13:31-35. Why does Jesus choose love as the thing that identifies his followers? What is it about love that is so distinguishing?
5. Why is it so important to "love our enemies?"

Action Over Words:

6. What are some practical ways you can help transform the definition of the word love in your relationships at home and work?
7. Pray together that God would cause us to be a people characterized by our love. What would it look like if the church were to be more loving?
